



## MAURIZIO MENSI

Professor of Law & Economics at the National School of Administration (SNA), where he is in charge of international projects, Mensi has considerable experience on legislative assistance in European and non-European countries as an expert of the European Commission (TAIEX, Technical Assistance Information Exchange Instrument), WTO, UNPD and Council of Europe (COE). Since 2006 he has undertaken missions ("Peer review assessment" and "Capacity Building"), to Albania, Moldova, Ukraine,

Bosnia-Herzegovina, Israel, Russia, Lebanon, Turkey, Tunisia, Serbia, Belarus, Macedonia, Libya, Latvia, Montenegro, Morocco, Mexico, Egypt, Kosovo, Armenia.

On the "roster" of experts for the *Dispute Settlement Body* in trade of goods (WTO), since 2018 he is alternate member for Italy of the Group of Independent Experts on the European Charter of local self-government - GIE (Council of Europe).

Mensi is also lawyer and adjunct professor of *Information and Communications Law* at the LUISS Guido Carli University of Rome, where he is co-head of @LawLab, a research centre on Cyber and TMT Law (Telecommunications-Media-Technology).

He combined a career working actively in the legal field as a State Attorney (1988-1989), a member of the Legal Service of the European Commission (1989-1994; 2017), a State Lawyer ("Avvocato dello Stato" (1994-1999) and Legal Director of the Italian Communications Authority (1998-2005), with a parallel career in academia, as adjunct Professor at the Cà Foscari University of Venice (1997-1999). He was also Chair of the Media and Minors Committee (2013-2016).
